

Opening hours:

6.30pm - 8pm on Monday to Friday

8am - 8pm on Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holidays



Accident and Emergency

In A&E you will be seen by specialist doctors and nurses ready to treat those with serious or **life-threatening** injuries and illnesses, which can include: loss of consciousness, persistent, severe chest pain, breathing difficulties and choking, severe bleeding that cannot be stopped, having fits, severe broken bones or burns.

How to access:

Call 999

Opening hours:

24 hours a day seven days a week



Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC)

GPs and nurses at the UTC are able to treat minor injuries or illnesses requiring immediate care, but not serious enough to require a visit to the A&E department.

Charing Cross Urgent Treatment Centre:

Opening hours: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

Hammersmith Urgent Treatment Centre:

Opening hours: 8am – 12 midnight, 7 days a week

Patients will need to attend the UTC before 11pm in order to complete their treatment before the unit closes at midnight.

St Mary's Urgent Treatment Centre:

Opening hours: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

Chelsea and Westminster Urgent Treatment Centre:

Opening hours: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week



NHS 111

NHS 111 is the **free** NHS non-emergency number. You can speak to a **fully trained adviser**, supported by healthcare professionals. They will ask questions to assess your symptoms and direct you to the best medical care for you.

Pharmacies

Your local pharmacist, or chemist, is a **highly trained healthcare professional**.

They can offer **free** advice and suggest medicines or treatments for many common problems such as headaches, stomach problems, coughs, and colds. Some pharmacists can also give flu vaccinations.




