- 2) **note** that discussions are on-going to work through the implications of devolution in relation to delegation at a London level and how the CCG can engage in and influence the proposal put forward; and
- 3) **note** that the Governing Body will have further opportunities to decide on the level of the CCG's involvement once the implications have been mapped out in greater detail,

Summary of purpose and scope of report

The London Health and Care Collaboration Agreement, which sets out our approach of exploring devolution at three levels - local, sub-regional and London-wide was agreed to in December 2015 and discussed by the Governing Body in January 2016.

The Agreement enables us to participate in discussions about devolving centrally-held powers to London. NWL CCGs are parties to the agreement but have not signed up to any of the pilots to date.

As the London Office's work progresses with the pilots, a second agreement is now being developed, building on the lessons learned. This update from the London Office seeks to brief Governing Bodies across London and seeks continuing commitment to exploring the opportunities and implications of health devolution across the capital.
